Reading


Over the last few weeks we have been looking at the tricky words: *I, the, to, go, no and into*. These are words that cannot be sounded out and must be learnt.

<u>Homework</u> - What sounds can your child recognise and write? Can they think of items that start with those sounds?

Maths

This week we have continued looking at subitising numbers 1-5. Subitising is the ability to recognise the number of objects in a quantity without counting.

<u>Homework</u> - Catch a glimpse game. Take 5 small objects and put them in a central pile. Without your child seeing, take some and hide them under a piece of paper. Then give your child a glimpse of what is under the paper. Ask the children how many objects they saw. Do a great reveal, have you both got the same number?
