
Phonics

This week, we have looked at the sounds from phase 3, (ai, ea, igh and oa). They enjoyed blending and segmenting words that have these sounds, including writing simple captions such as: The snail in the rain.

Next week, they will be looking at these sounds: oo, ar and or. They will learn how to blend words such: boots, look, car, bark, corn and fork. We will also be completing phonic assessments.

Question of the week

What is your favourite number and why?



<u>Homework</u> - Children should complete their phonics activity sheet to ensure they continue to consolidate their learning.

Maths - This week, children have been learning all about Number Bonds to 5. They enjoyed completing practical activities to identify which two parts of a number makes a whole number to 5. For example, 3+2=5. They were also challenged to write number sentence.

Next week, they will be completing a Maths assessment that will cover all the learning that has taken place this term such as: 2D and 3D shapes, repeating patterns and number bonds to 5.

<u>Homework</u> - Please help your child to continue to count objects around your home and ask them how many more things do you need to make 5? How many more do you need to make 10? For example, there are 3 spoons, how many more do you need to make 5?

<u>Discovery Book</u>- The children will be bringing discovery book homework for them to write about the question of the week. Encourage your child to use the resources attached on the book for them to write a sentence about the question using a pencil and remind them to remember to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop. The spellings are also attached in their discovery book.
