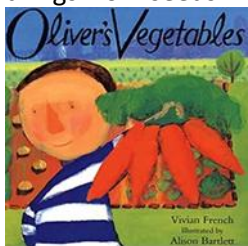

Our Learning

This Week

The children are enjoying **Oliver's Vegetables** by Vivian French, illustrated by Alison Bartlett. We are talking about growing things from seeds.

In Phonics we are learning the letter 'd' for drum and using robot talk to sound out new words: dip, din, drum.

For Science Week the children have enjoyed watching their cress start to grow and have been using a ruler to measure it. It has grown 5cm in 7 days!

Next Week

Last week of Oliver's Vegetables and also learning new vegetable and fruit names and the days of the week. We will be sowing more seeds outside in pots and talking to the children about growing.

Please remember to place your child's cress pot by a window and water it just a little every few days. If you can print at home please record the growth of the little cress seedling!



When the cress is fully grown (about 10 days) it can be eaten as a tiny salad leaf or in an egg mayonnaise sandwich!

Our new role play will be a café and the children will experience and taste a variety of vegetables.

The children enjoyed painting flowers so perhaps vegetable drawings and paintings will be next.

Mobile Phones

When you are coming onto school grounds to collect or deliver children, we would kindly ask you to refrain from using your phone. Thank you.

So, what is school readiness? Well, we see it as a measure of how prepared a child is to succeed in school, cognitively, socially and emotionally. This allows teachers to focus on developing skills and stops young children playing 'catch up', so they can develop their love for school and parents can be confident that their child is coping well with the transition.

Sadly, the last statistical data shows that in Hillingdon 1 in 2 children are 'school ready' compared to Lewisham where about 3 in 4 children are school ready - [fingertips.phe.org.uk](https://www.fingertips.phe.org.uk) 2014. And the pandemic will not have improved this situation.

So, we are offering all parents of young children, who are about to go to school for the first time a free course, details are:
