Phonics

We have now started our Phase 3 letter sounds:

j,v,w,x,y,z,zz,qu,ch,sh,th,ng,ai,ee,igh,oa,oo,ar,or,ur,ow,oi and ear. Please practise Phase 3 sounds at home and blend these sounds to make words. For example: j-a-m, v-a-n, w-e-b etc.

<u>Homework</u> - It is very important that the children read at home to develop their writing and comprehension skills. Please practice letter and number formation at home. Please make sure your child's name is clearly marked on any homework returned to your class teacher. Thank you.

Maths

This week we continuing to write numbers above 15, and describing 2D shapes. Please remind children to name 2D shapes as well as knowing the number of sides.

<u>Homework</u> - Please continue to practise writing numerals above 15 and name 2D shapes.

You could play a game with 2D shapes and a bag that your child cannot see through:

- 1. Hide a shape in the bag and ask your child to feel the shape.
- 2. Ask your child to describe the shape as best they can and try to work out what it is.
- 3. Once your child has told you what shape they think it is, take it out to see if they were correct.
