Stage 1: Good Attendance (96% and above)


- Message: "Fantastic! Your child is attending regularly and making the most of learning opportunities."

Stage 3: Serious Concern (Below 90%)

- Message: "Persistent absence is a serious issue. It impacts learning and may lead to formal intervention."
- · Action: Meeting with school and Home visit
