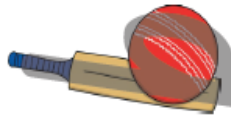

The children have now learnt different actions to use when retelling the story.

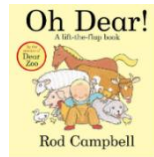
In Phonics we have been learning our new sound and letter 'b'.
