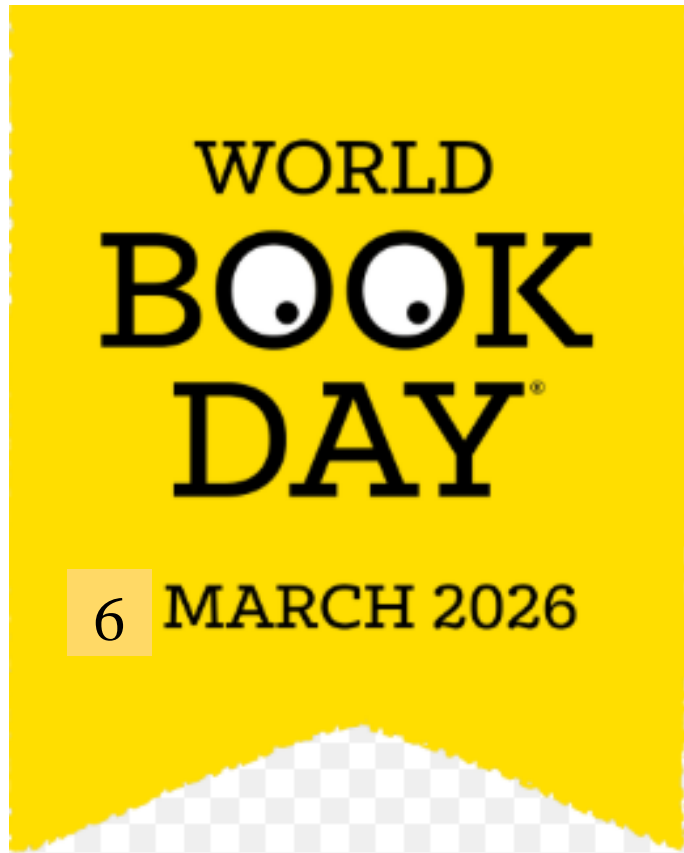

### This Week

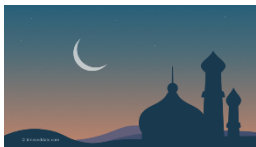
This week we read a range of stories about Lunar New Year. We discussed how people celebrate this special time of year.



In Phonics we have been revisiting all the sounds we have learnt so far. We were very impressed to see that the children could remember all the sounds we had learnt last half term!

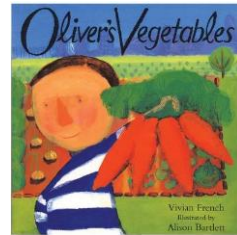
In maths, we revisited recognising numerals to 5 and subitising which is the ability to know how many there are in a small collection without counting them.
