- **Action:** Continue encouraging punctuality and daily attendance

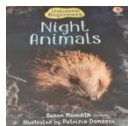
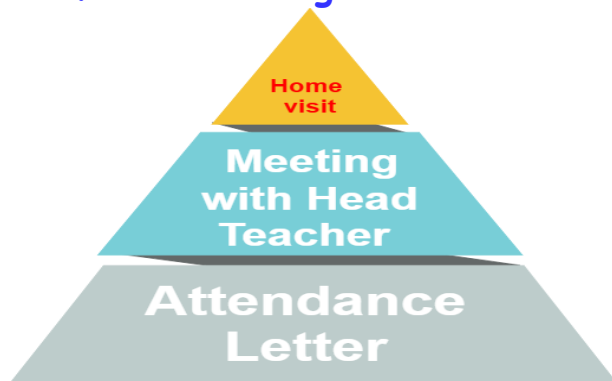
Stage 2: Cause for Concern (90%–95%)

- **Message:** “Attendance is starting to slip. Missing lessons can affect progress.”
- **Action:** We’ll contact you to discuss any challenges and offer support.

Stage 3: Serious Concern (Below 90%)

- **Message:** “Persistent absence is a serious issue. It impacts learning and may lead to formal intervention.”
- **Action:** Meeting with school and Home visit
