Headteacher's Message

Welcome to the November issue of the Yeading Infants News. Children have been at school now for 12 weeks. It has been pleasing to see the focus and determination all the children are showing in their learning and behaviour. The focus is also, as always, on 100% attendance during this period. Punctuality is also very important because learning begins as soon as the children arrive. Stay safe and healthy and let's see how many children get their certificates before the end of the year!

We continue to work alongside local organisations like Brunel University on the Rainbow Project where children have been able to understand more about emotional regulation. Children are keen to share their learning with you and you can find out more through discussing with your child the activities in the Rainbow Pack workbook that all children have received.

Children are also learning more outside the classroom. Teachers are working hard to ensure immersive learning experience for children that will support language and learning. We are using all the spaces around the school and integrating them into lessons including cooking and physical movement wherever possible.

Children also have access to two free apps to support their learning at home. We recommend a short 10 minute session to ensure screen time is monitored but the children have consistent opportunities for learning. This will help them towards their targets at the end of the year.

We are also very excited to be starting Friends of Yeading. If you are interested in supporting the school, please find out how later in the newsletter.

Finally I would like to re-

mind all the parents and carers that we will be hosting the annual Christmas shows in December. You are all kindly invited to attend. More information can be found in your child's weekly newsletters. I look forward to seeing you all there.

At Yeading we have a fantastic Breakfast Club to support all our families including those parents who are working. Breakfast club is now in our brand new Play Pod in the school playground. Children have access to a healthy breakfast, time to play and make new

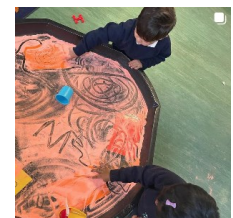
