It was lovely to see most of our parents attending the recent Parents meetings this month. I know that you found this useful and will be working with your children at home to help them achieve their end of year targets. Thank you also to all the parents who have been accessing the Rhino Readers platform which is being provided free to all children. The books link in with the Twinkl Phonics scheme we have been using to support early reading. We are also

working on renewing our Leading Parent Partnership Award (LPPA). If you would like to help by telling us about positive experiences you have had with the school, please speak to Ms Malik at the school office.

Children have represented the school at a recent maths competition in which they did very well. We are looking forward to more local visits and competitions in the upcoming term. Children now have access to three free apps to support their learning at home. We are very pleased to be offering Doodle, Bug Club and Rhino Readers to support learning at home. We recommend a short 10 minute session daily to ensure screen time is monitored but the children have consistent opportunities for learning. This will help them towards their targets at the end of the year.

Finally I would like to re-

mind all the parents and carers that we will be hosting the annual Christmas shows in December. You are all kindly invited to attend. More information can be found in your child's weekly newsletter. I look forward to seeing you all there.

As part of our continued focus on high standards in reading, writing and maths, staff have been thinking of lots of ideas to support learning at home. at school to help children learn the basics.

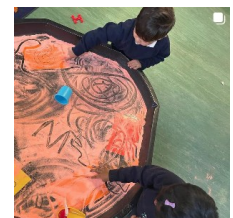

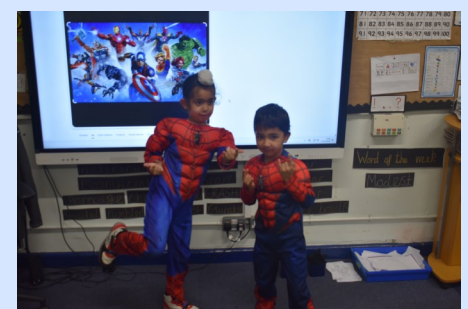
