Bank of England Competition

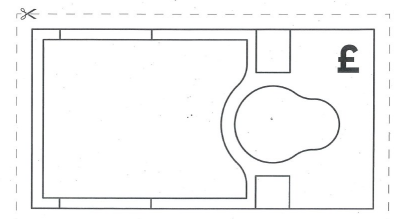

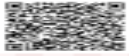

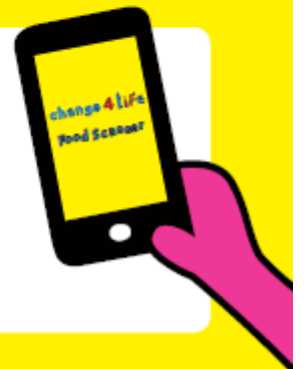
